Thank you for yours letter from December 23th. The advent of a state of war has really complicated the question of materials obtainable in the United States but Prof. Compton gave we a hope that some material shall be available for us.

I am grateful to you for the interest you have show to our problems and for the assurance you gave that everything possible shall be done in order to satisfy some of our needs.

The list of materials I send to you contains objects which are not connected necessarily between them, so that if only a part is available, it should be useful to us even if the magnet and the counters shall not arrive. (We can build the counters in our laboratory). I hope that we shall have the pleasure to see you in S. Paulo soon and to be able to discuss the whole matter directly. We are moving in these days in a better and greater building.

The scientific researches of our Laboratory are going on as usual. Some fo them have appeared and shall appear in Physical Review and the Annaes da AACademia Brasileira de Sciencias.
