

CORDOBA, July 17th 1943

My dear Wataghin,

I thank you for your very kind letter of June 24th. It is, indeed, awfully nice of you to care about Dr. Monteiro's position. But he deserves it really, he is really a very excellent mathematician.

I forward to you herewith Dr. Monteiro's list of publications which may be useful to you. I am waiting impatiently for Dr. v. Neumann's reply in order to accelerate things here. I think it would be possible to find a position either in Argentina or in Perú, but for a Portuguese Brasil would be more indicated.

I wired to Dr. Monteiro that he was proposed in Brasil, but that one could not yet know whether and when he would become appointed. I advised him to try to emigrate to Brasil and to look for a job then. Finally I told him about the efforts to be made here and in Lima (Peru). I gave you Dr. Monteiro's adress in my last letter:

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As soon as I have some news, I am to go to wire again. -

I am looking forward with great pleasure to your next paper which you announce to me. We shall be delighted to discuss your papers here. May be there will be one day a possibility to have you coming here to tell us personnally more about your work.

I am trying to work on quantum electrodynamics and I have a few results from Europe to be published now. But it will take still some time until I will have everything ready.
