
Dear Mr. Schutzer:

I was delighted to receive your recent letter proposing to come here to Princeton. The interesting discussions I have had in the past with Professor Schonberg and Professor Wataghin make me eager to become acquainted with you and to discuss some of the problems in physics that stand before us now.

In regard to the possibility of admitting you to Princeton University, I should say that the ease of making this step depends to some extent on the question whether you will have already received your Doctor's Degree by September. If so, there will be absolutely no question at all. If not, the question of admission depends to some extent on circumstances. Thus, although we had seventy applications this February for men desiring to do advanced work here toward their Ph. D. degrees in September, we have been allowed by the University to accept only six. Even in case you will not have received your degree by fall, there will be a certain distinct possibility of arranging for your admission to the University, but this possibility will depend upon circumstances. I have written to Dr. Miller of the Rockefeller Foundation and have also cabled Professors Watachin and Schonberg.

I should appreciate it if you would fill out the enclosed form which will facilitate making final arrangements here. I will let you know about the progress of the matter as things develop. In the meantime I send best regards and hope that I shall have the pleasure of seeing you here in the fall.
