Dear Mr. Keizer:

This is almost literally a last-minute note: Talking to the freight-forwarding people I learned at first that Colonel Fribo's had suggested to send the equipment to Rio. After checking with him I found that it was his opinion that the existence of the Conselho would be practicable only in Rio, but he also thought that if the material is announced, at my arrival, as my personal luggage it should not be troublesome to get it out of customs at Santos. If that is your plan, everything is as arranged, if you believe that the Conselho's intervention is needed, the address should - and still could - be changed. Colonel Fribo's also repeatedly emphasized that somebody from Sao Paulo should be present at Santos when I arrive.

Thus, please: if you don't want the equipment shipped to Santos, write immediately to H. W. St. John & Co., 18 Pearl Street, New York, N.Y. (the shipping company) suggesting the change. Unless they hear from you, the equipment will probably go to Santos on the 23rd.

And then: we should not really meet soon!
